

## **HKICPA** seminar:

## Managing Third Party Rights – Global Developments and Best Local Practice

The Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Ordinance (Cap 623) came into effect on 1 January 2016. Broadly the Ordinance alters the doctrine of "privity of contract" – as a result it is no longer the case that only parties to the contract are able to enforce a benefit conferred by that contract. This change offers companies an opportunity to cater to third party needs when contracting (e.g. perhaps to benefit a related company which is strictly speaking external to the contract), but also increases the risk of third party intervention in contractual arrangements.

This seminar will briefly discuss the privity of contract and examine the legal issues arising, before dealing with the practical consequences of the Ordinance and suggesting how new benefits and protections might best be captured and any additional risks mitigated. This seminar is intended to be practical, and so the issues examined will be illustrated by both case studies and drafting examination.

After joining this seminar, participants will gain knowledge about:

- The new regime imposed by the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Ordinance (Cap 623)
- The extent to which non contracting parties can obtain benefits under contracts, and how those parties might be excluded from that benefit
- A practical application of the possible contractual adjustments prompted by the new regime
