China's Belt and Road (i.e. Silk Road Economic Belt and 21st Century Maritime Silk Road) Initiative aims to promote closer economic cooperation among Asian, European and African continents and their adjacent seas, establish and strengthen partnerships among the 60+ countries along the routes, set up all-dimensional, multi-tiered and composite connectivity networks, and realize diversified, independent, balanced and sustainable development in the countries.
