Integrating Medical and Social Support for Elderly – System and Technology Enabled Service Innovation

The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants continues the Current Affairs Series to promote members' awareness on important social and economic issues in Hong Kong. At the fifth seminar of the series, Prof. John Leong Chi-yan, Chairman of the Hong Kong Hospital Authority (HA), will discuss integrating medical and social support for the elderly.

With a rapidly ageing population and increasing number of patients with chronic diseases, the demand of HA services is expected to rise sharply in the coming years. In this seminar, Prof. Leong will give a presentation on the systematic approach the HA has adopted to enhance medical and care support to elderly patients based on their stratified needs. Measures include strengthening integrated comprehensive needs assessment, discharge planning and post-discharge transitional care support, enhancing disease management and self-care support for elderly patients with chronic diseases, and strengthening targeted preventive care, patient and carer empowerment to help elderly patients stay healthy in the community. He will also talk about the key enablers such as multidisciplinary care, strengthening of medical-social collaboration, and use of technology.
