Startup and Venture Capital: Challenges for Investors and Companies (SCPD18101201)

Course outline

This seminar covers the challenges in the startup and venture capital (VC) community from the perspectives of both the entrepreneurs looking for capital partners as well as the venture capital/ early stage investors looking to fund such businesses. Topics include:

- VC and early stage investors looking for the right companies to invest in
- Barriers in taking business from startup to successful high growth

Mr. Thian Chew, Managing Partner, Polar Ventures

Mr. Chew is a Managing Partner at Polar Ventures, a private equity firm that focuses on small-medium sized enterprises in Asia. Mr. Chew was previously an Executive Director at Goldman Sachs, both in Hong Kong and New York, where he made proprietary investments in growth capital, distressed and special situations.

Prior to Goldman Sachs, Mr. Chew worked at Morgan Stanley (New York), was a Director at KPMG Consulting (Singapore, Sydney) focused on managing large-scale operational restructuring, post-merger integration and business performance improvement programs; and Senior Manager at KPMG (Taipei, Melbourne) performing financial and information technology audit and assurance.

Mr. Chew graduated with an MBA from the Wharton School as a Palmer Scholar; an MA from the Lauder Institute, University of Pennsylvania; a Bachelor of Information Systems from Monash University; and qualified as a Chartered Accountant. Mr. Chew is an Adjunct Associate Professor at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology's MBA program.



Sustainable Business for Entrepreneurs (SCPD18102401)

Course outline

Statistics shows that only 5% of the business can be sustainable for 10 years, 0.39% for 20 years and 0.025% for 30 years. Therefore, it would be one of the biggest challenges for entrepreneurs and management executives to sustain their business for longevity. Japan has the most number of centennial enterprises in the world. Important factors for success include the preservation of the great corporate philosophy and culture of the enterprises, and also the innovation to cope with the changing world. - Trademark registration
- Handling of disputes with clients
- Overview of the related IP
- IP protection systems in both Hong Kong and China

Mr. Lawrence Yeung, Partner, ONC Lawyers

Mr. Yeung is a practicing solicitor in Hong Kong with an LLM and a PhD in Laws. He has over 15 years of experience in handling commercial and IP disputes and non-contentious matters.

Mr. Yeung's professional IP practice covers overseas regions such as Europe, the United States and Asia. His expertise includes reviewing IP portfolio for enterprises to identify any structural defects and giving advice thereon; assisting enterprises in setting up IP projects/ asset management and global brand protection strategies; protection of IPR in investment agreements; trademark clearance, maintenance and applications; copyright protection; PCT filing; design applications and protection; IPR capitalization; licensing agreements; analysis and search; dispute resolution; IPR protection, due diligence, transactions and licensing negotiations, etc. Mr. Yeung often represents the Law Society of Hong Kong and his law firm to speak at various conferences on the latest IP cases and the importance of proper IPR management for enterprises and key points to note.

Mr. Yeung has been appointed as expert in the Center for Enterprise Legal Rights Protection and Resolution of Complex Cases of Liaoning Province, Advisor of Hong Kong Intellectual Property Department IP Consultation Service and as part-time tutor and lecturer of master degree courses in Intellectual Property offered by universities in Hong Kong. He has more than 10 years of teaching experience and also published a number of essays on both the practical and academic aspects of various legal areas.
