# Taxation of termination payments and tax litigations

# About the topic

On 14 November 2019, the Court of Final Appeal ("CFA") handed down its decision on the case of Commissioner of Inland Revenue v Poon Cho-ming, John FACV No.1 of 2019, upholding the Court of Appeal's decision, dismissing the Commissioner's appeal, ultimately deciding in favour of the taxpayer and concluding that a Payment in Lieu of Bonus and Share Option Gain arising from a Separation Agreement should not be subject to Salaries Tax.

The decision brings further clarity to the taxation of termination payments and affirms the principles established in Fuchs case, i.e., that a payment made in return for acting or being an employee is taxable, whereas a payment that is "for something else" is not. The long running nature of this case, differing views and sizeable body of case law on the taxation of termination payments demonstrate that it can often be difficult to apply the principles and there is often a fine distinction between what is taxable as oppose to non-taxable. Taxpayer's success in tax litigation is often dependent on a robust technical position together with a good and coordinated tax litigation preparedness strategy.

The speakers will re-visit the case and share their experience in supporting taxpayers in profits tax and salaries tax litigations by going through the long tax dispute process.
