The new Mainland China foreign investment law and its tax implications to red-chips/offshore structures investing into Mainland China

About the topic

The new Foreign Investment Law was adopted at the Second Session of the 13th National People's Congress. The new law and its implementation rule came into effect on 1 January 2020. The introduction of Mainland China's new Foreign Investment Law and its implementing rules marks a fundamental change in Mainland China's foreign business system. It redefines "Foreign Investment" and "Foreign-invested Enterprise" and clears pre-entry national treatment and negative list management system.

Following the last seminar held in late August 2019, the speakers will cover the following topics in this seminar:

- Major changes and highlights of the new law and implementing rules
- Potential impacts on foreign-invested enterprises and actions that need to be taken
- Legal and tax implications to red-chips / offshore structures investing into Mainland China
