# Applying for Hong Kong Tax Resident Certificates: Requirements and practical case sharing

## About the topic

A Hong Kong Tax Resident Certificate (HKTRC) is an important supporting document for making a tax treaty benefit claim as it serves as proof of the Hong Kong tax residence status of a taxpayer. However, applying for an HKTRC has now become more challenging than ever, particularly since the start of the Base Erosion and Profit Shifting initiative, as the Inland Revenue Department (IRD) has tightened its review of HKTRC applications and has been focusing not only on where businesses are incorporated or managed and controlled, but also on the applicants' business "substance" in Hong Kong.

In addition, in the light of the Public Notice 9 (2018), issued by the State Tax Administration (STA), which sets out the STA's approach in assessing beneficial ownership status for granting benefits under the Mainland's tax treaties, the IRD seems to be challenging HKTRC applications relating to PN9 cases more frequently.

- share the practical challenges faced by taxpayers in making HKTRC applications relating to PN9
- share information on real examples of HKTRC applications
