Cross-border Insolvency at a Crossroads

Event code: SCPD22103101

About the topic

In recent months, the courts have delivered a number of decisions that could (once again) change significantly the landscape of cross-border insolvency in Hong Kong. Questions raised include the following:-

- In order to wind-up a non-Hong Kong company, how can the second core requirement (i.e. benefits to creditors) be satisfied?
- When can foreign liquidators be recognised and given assistance (if at all)?
- Is the place of incorporation or centre of main interests (COMI) the primary consideration for the courts to assume winding-up jurisdiction?
- Can "soft-touch" provisional liquidators still be recognised?
- What is the latest approach to cross-border restructuring?

The RIF has invited leading practitioners, Mr. Clifford Smith SC and Mr. Look-Chan Ho, who are intimately involved in these developments, to explain these and other current cross-border insolvency issues.
