



Joint ICTIG-FSIG e-Seminar – Financial services in the era of generative AI: Facilitating responsible adoption

Generative AI has the potential to enhance productivity in the financial services industry, but also poses emerging risks as the technology continues to evolve. As generative AI adoption in the financial services industry continues to rise, it becomes increasingly important to understand the challenges of responsible integration and the role of regulation in enabling its ethical use.

In this e-Seminar, the speaker covers two major areas: first, the trends in generative AI adoption within Hong Kong's financial services industry, focusing on implications for risk management, talent strategies, and the role of regulation; and second, a detailed analysis of findings from surveys and interviews on Hong Kong's financial services industry that offer in-depth insights into adoption practices, risk management, talent development, and collaborative approaches.
