

## Sustainability Assurance Series

In March 2025, the Institute issued HKSSA 5000, *General Requirements for Sustainability Assurance Engagements*. This landmark standard marks a significant step forward in strengthening confidence and trust in sustainability information among intended users in Hong Kong. HKSSA 5000 provides a robust framework for performing high-quality sustainability assurance engagements. Its objective is to enhance the reliability, transparency, and credibility of the disclosed sustainability information. The standard is effective for assurance engagements on sustainability information reported for periods beginning on or after 15 December 2026 or as at a specific date on or after 15 December 2026. Earlier application is permitted.

- Strengthening practitioners' skills in sustainability assurance
- Preparing professional accountants to navigate the evolving sustainability landscape
- Equipping professional accountants to address key challenges in assurance engagements

### **E-learning: Sustainability Assurance Series – Overview of HKSSA 5000, General Requirements for Sustainability Assurance Engagements**

This inaugural e-learning of the sustainability assurance capacity building programme will provide a comprehensive overview of the new assurance standard, covering the following key aspects:

- Fundamental principles and concepts, including limited and reasonable assurance, and firm-level quality management
- Engagement acceptance and continuance, including preconditions for assurance
- Group sustainability assurance engagements and the use of the work of others

- Understanding the entity's reporting policies
- Understanding the entity and its environment and the legal and regulatory framework
- Understanding the components of the entity's system of internal control
- Identifying and assessing the risks of material misstatement



**E-learning (Workshop 3): Responding to Risks of Material Misstatement (Event code: WSHP25091701)**

This workshop will cover considerations and procedures in responding to risks of material misstatement (ROMM) in the planning stage, as well as in the concluding and reporting stage. Topics will be covered:

- General considerations and overall responses
- Procedures in response to ROMM at the disclosure level and at the assertion level for the disclosures
- Evaluating the sufficiency and appropriateness of evidence obtained
- Evaluating the effect of uncorrected misstatements
- Form and content of assurance reports (i.e. limited assurance vs reasonable assurance)
