

Unlocking Mainland Assets: Cross-Border Asset Recovery Strategies for Hong Kong Proceedings

About the topic

With cross-border disputes on the rise, parties often commence proceedings in Hong Kong while some substantial assets are located in Mainland China. In these cases, securing a favorable Hong Kong judgment or arbitral award is only the first step, value is realised only if assets can be finally enforced. Effective recovery often depends on timely preservation, recognition and enforcement measures in the Mainland, together with proper coordination of actions on both sides of the border.

In this seminar, the speaker will share practical experience on several issues that often make the difference in cross-border recovery, including:

- Mainland property preservation in support of Hong Kong-seated arbitration – when available, where to file, what is required, what it costs, how long it takes, and other key considerations;
- Recognition and enforcement of Hong Kong arbitral awards and judgments in the Mainland – where to file, what is required, what it costs, how long it takes, and how enforcement proceeds in Mainland China; and
- Cross-border guarantees and security arrangements – choice of forum, claims against Mainland guarantors, and coordination of parallel Hong Kong and Mainland proceedings.
