Mr Tony Lam was an Administrative Officer in the Hong Kong Government for almost two decades before serving the Hong Kong Productivity Council as a Director. Prior to joining the Office of the Privacy Commissioner for Personal Data, Mr Lam was a Senior Advisor to a private sector firm specialising in public policy consultancy.

Over the years, Mr Lam has been involved with public policy formulation and implementation in a very wide range of areas, including trade, industry, innovation and technology development, driving government policies and fostering an environment for harnessing the potential of innovation and technology to transform Hong Kong industries into high value-adding ones.

Mr Lam has also been a Hong Kong Government representative stationed in Washington, D.C. of the United States, and served two Chief Executives as their Clerk to the Executive Council. During his time as a Director of the Hong Kong Productivity Council, Mr Lam led various supporting functions such as human resources development, finance, procurement, management information services, corporate communications and the Council secretariat.
